International Bank of Commerce-Oklahoma v. Lane Gorman Trubitt, LLC et al., 2022 WL 3088577 (Tex. App.—Amarillo August 3, 2022, pet. dismissed) (mem. op.) – Obtained and successfully defended on appeal a take nothing summary judgment for auditors in a multi-million-dollar negligent misrepresentation and fraud case involving the Reagor-Dykes auto dealerships, which filed for bankruptcy after engaging in perhaps the largest auto financing fraud in United States history.
